General Information



Registration

- Early registration deadline is May 18, 2018. Register early for a reduced rate for Adventure and Breakaway Camp! Camp reservations are on a first come first serve basis.
- Please see ymcacw.org/summer-day-camp to register.
- Initial registration and adding or dropping sessions are done through our office to verify availability of space. Cancellations must be done in writing.
- There is a \$35 deposit per child per session. Deposits are applied to the corresponding weekly fee.
- The **registration fee** is a one time fee for our 2018 Summer Day Camp and is due upon receipt of paper registration. One child is \$30 and two or more children are \$50. Registration fee is waived for online registrations.

If using paper registration, please mail or drop off the registration form, deposits and registration fee at our office.

Faxed registrations are not accepted.

Online registration is also available beginning April 23 at **ymcacw.org/summer-day-camp**. When registering online, health forms should be submitted to our office two weeks prior to starting camp.

- All registrations need to go through an approval process and are dependent upon space availability.
- We will send confirmation of registration.
- All programs are closed on July 4. All programs will also be closed on either Aug. 24 or Aug. 31. Please see desired site for details.
- Limited space available for year round participants week nine, Thursday and Friday, as well as weeks 10 and 11, in Portland. On July 16, weeks 9 – 11 will be open to the general public. Please contact us for more information.

What is the Payment Process?

- The balance for each camp week (camp rate, minus deposit) is due 14 days prior to the first day of the applicable session. The \$35 deposit is non-refundable if a payment is not made made by the due date. A late fee of \$15 may be applied to each session per child if payment is not received on time.
- All deposits are non-refundable and non-transferable.
- Registrations received less than 14 days prior to the start of a session require payment in full.
- Registrations require three business days for processing.
- We accept third party billing. Please contact us for details.
- When you register online you are automatically charged weekly fees on the due date with the card on file.

Are Part-time Options Available?

All camps, unless noted, operate five days per week (M–F). Part-time may be available at a two or three day option. Limited spaces are available after May 18 for a \$60 per day fee. Contact our office for more information about the location of your choice. Please note that for part-time participation, days of attendance must be established before camp begins. Various activities, including field trips, differ at each location and when choosing the part-time option, your child will miss some activities. Online registration is not available for part-time participants.

Are There Any Discounts?

- There is a five percent multiple child discount, and the discount applies to each child.
- A \$20 discount for session three is applied, because we are closed on July 4. A \$20 discount is applied to either session 10 or 11 as a result of the Aug. 24 and/or Aug. 31 in-service closures.
- Non year round program participants at Portland Public School locations will pay a reduced rate of \$180 for week nine.

What if I Can't Afford Camp?

Is there financial assistance? Yes!

- The YMCA provides financial assistance to low-income family households. Scholarships are available through a confidential application process.
- Scholarship forms are available at our office or online at **ymcacw.org/childcare**.
- We will evaluate the scholarship application and will notify you of the amount awarded. Applications must be received and processed by our office two weeks prior to the first session of camp you wish to register for.
- Scholarships are not retroactive.
